Tom Suozzi Finds Solutions

We face an immigration crisis because too many politicians have spent too much time fighting - but haven't done a thing to fix the problem. Democrats and Republicans need to come together to find a solution.

In Congress, Tom Suozzi worked across the political aisle with his Republican colleague Peter King to draft a "Grand Compromise," a comprehensive immigration reform package that was published in *The New York Times*.

Tom's bi-partisan plan calls for an increase in border security funding, reduces migration from Central America, and creates legal status for five million undocumented immigrants who have lived and worked in the US for years.

Tom Suozzi visited the border three times to meet with patrol agents and local law enforcement officials. He knows we need to do something. And he's willing to work with anyone to get it done.
